Registration for the 2017 YKACL Summer Youth Program has begun!


This free annual program is open to teens and young adults aged 13 to 25 living in Yellowknife, Ndilo and Dettah.

SPRING IS IN THE AIR at YKACL. We invite the public to participate in a street-side beautification project while learning hands-on artistic skills this month using local materials.

YKACL Business Services participants are working alongside project co-ordinators Rosanna Strong and Jenny Tucker to finish the willow arches and create a living willow fence next to



d create a living willow fence next to the Abe Miller Building parking lot. Residents of Yellowknife, Ndilo and

Dettah are encouraged to join in. If you can tie string together, you are gualified!

There is a role for everyone no matter what their skill level or gardening background. Many hands

make for light work from weaving the willow to preparing the fence structures.

We are using a combination of basketry techniques like random weave that uses tension between twigs pressed against one another for its structural strength on the arches and a twill weave

for the fences. As time allows, willow sun bursts and obelisks will be used to decorate the garden areas.


