MedicAlert Autism Program available across the North

Bracelets and shoe tags communicate with emergency responders

AUTISM CANADA has partnered with MedicAlert Foundation Canada to create a unique program designed specifically to support Canadians on the autism spectrum and provide peace of mind to families and caregivers.

The MedicAlert Autism Program launched across Canada on April 10.

Autism isn't always recognizable to those who don't know the signs, and this can make those on the spectrum particularly vulnerable in an emergency situation.

HOW THE PROGRAM WORKS

The program is available to all Canadians on the autism spectrum.

Subscribers provide MedicAlert with the relevant personal information (routines, triggers and de-escalation techniques) and medical information (allergies, medications) emergency responders need in an emergency.



If an individual with autism is unable to effectively communicate, MedicAlert tells emergency responders what they need to know.

The program costs \$60 for new subscribers.

BENEFITS OF THE PROGRAM Voice in an emergency: if an individual with autism is unable to effectively communicate, MedicAlert tells emergency responders what they need to know

and empowers them to make informed decisions.

Designed to medical standards: MedicAlert's medically-trained specialists ensure that all information on the MedicAlert ID adheres to globally accepted medical standards that are critically relied on by emergency responders.

Critical assistance in seconds: Medicalert's 24/7 Emergency Hotline relays key medical and personal information to emergency responders within an average of five seconds of a call, in 140 languages.

Family notification: MedicAlert will notify family of the situation and whereabouts of the subscriber at the time of an emergency.

Educates emergency responders: MedicAlert specifically trains emergency responders including police and paramedics to look for the authentic emblem, read the information and call the 24/7 Emergency Hotline.
