Employers find workers through Odd Job Squad

THE ODD JOB SQUAD connected 11 clients with nine different employers last month, including four clients who transitioned into long-term paid employment.

The Odd Job Squad seeks to assist under-employed individuals who self-identify with a disability to make some money from one-time or short-term work while they search for permanent employment.

"The whole idea is that we are trying to give a chance to people who happen to have a disability, to get involved in some income-generating activities," said employment support worker John Balamaga. "For some committed clients, temporary work can eventually lead to long-term employment."

Employers last month included the Yellowknife Curling Club, DME Driving School and several other local businesses and private households. Paid tasks ranged from custodial projects and temporary construction assistance to deliveries and dump runs.
