YKACL clients eligible to apply for free city transit and facility passes!

ONE WAY TO STAY ACTIVE on a rainy day is to hop on a bus to the Clty of Yellowknife facilities, such as the pool or track.

For many YKACL clients, it won't cost a dime!

YKACL clients and their families are eligible to apply for free annual Flexipasses and Bus Passes through the City of Yellowknife's Access for All Program.

Families with a household income below \$50,000 and families with a person with a disability who may require adult accompaniment to access city facilities are encouraged to apply.

This provides access to:

- Yellowknife Transit and Yellowknife Accessible Transit Service (YATS)
 - All public and family activities at:
 - Ruth Inch Memorial Pool
 - Multiplex
 - Fieldhouse
 - All drop-in programs
 - i.e. Playtogether and drop-in sport

BUSINESS SERVICES TEAM UPDATE

OUR BUSINESS SERVICES TEAM distributed 370 posters in June for customers ranging from the Yellowknife Farmers Market to the Prince of Wales Northern Heritage Centre.

The team also completed 119 courier assignments and 74 recycling pick-ups.

The Business Services Team operates through the YKACL Skills Training and Community Inclusion Service for adults with intellectual disabilities (ST&CI).

The Business Services Team offers:

- Special projects

Team revenue is paid in wages to the clients providing the service.

DOWN TO EARTH EDUCATION

CLIENTS IN THE ADULT Literacy class at the Literacy Outreach Centre worked on a vegetable garden throughout May and June.

Julie White (May 13, 2019): I planted sweet pea, my favorite flower.

I think that tomatoes will sprout in 12 days.

I think that kales will sprout in 6 days. I think that lettuce will sprout in 6 days.

I think that Sweet Peas will sprout 6 days.

Gilbert Beaudoin (May 15, 2019): We planted the seed on may 9th. The lettuce sprouted around may This project has allowed the class to discuss the benefits of eating local, the importance of eating fruits and vegetables and the cost of healthy food.

It has also provided a chance to work

11th or 12th.

The kale also sprouted around may 11th or 12th.

The sweet peas sprouted today may 15th. The tomatoes sprouted today may 15th.

Chris Strus (June 10, 2019): We clean up around yard and we picked garbage.

We help to fill the planter with soil. The weather is getting hotter and the sun is shining. on reading, writing and math using a real-world project. Clients have kept a record of their work in their garden journals.

See below for the students' favourite excerpts from their journals:

Emma Moorhouse (June 13th, 2019): Today my class edited the planter by adding nails and string in the form of a graph by tying the end of each piece, hammering the nails, bringing and planting the seedlings outside.

And putting them in newly made holes, and watering them with a watering can along with new plants then coming inside from the heat.

I might have made friends with a mouse?
